## **GMU Partners with The People's Catholic Seminary**

Global Ministries University has just entered into a partnership with The People's Catholic Seminary to offer a Master of Pastoral Ministry degree completion program. The PCS is headed by Founders Dr. Bridget Mary Meehan, who is Bishop of the Association of Roman Catholic Women Priests and Dr. Mary Theresa Streck, who is also associated with ARCWP. The purpose of this program is to offer specific training for ordination of women into the priesthood at a reasonable cost, allowing more women to answer their calling to become a priest. However, this program is also open to both women and men who would like to prepare for pastoral ministry.

By the year 2050 Christianity and Islam will represent about 50% of the world's population and most of this population will lie outside of Europe and North America. Global Ministries University will seek to expand our mission to meet the needs of this larger framework for the future of Christianity in the United States, Africa and Latin America. We have been involved in Africa for the past six years through our interfaith training program in Kenya. We also can envision new programs which serve the needs of those involved in Hispanic oreitnies ministries here in the USA.
