The cohort of 40+ international students started on June 15. Lee McCoy, GMU's Registrar, states, *"We have students from three continents, men and women, ranging in age from 20s to 60s! A very diverse group!"* Half of the students in the new cohort of the Religion and Science program are receiving financial support from GMU Board of Trustees members. These new students are located in Africa and India and have important pastoral roles In their countries. The GMU Kenyan Fund is also providing scholarships for students.

The Harmony Foundation in Kenya is funding scholarships for several Muslim students in the Religion and Science program and is also supporting the participation of Professor Reginald Nalugala of Tangaza University as a member of the GMU delegation at the Parliament of the World's Religions.

Father Augustine Pamplany of the Science and Religion Institute in India will also join GMU at the Parliament of Religions.



### Hans Kung and the Global Ethic




President Gerald Grudzen hosted a Zoom interfaith event on **Wednesday**, **June 21, 2023, at 4 PM Pacific Time** recognizing the contribution of Hans Kung to the Global Ethic movement of the Parliament of the World's Religions.

Kung played a key role in the restarting of the Parliament in 1993 and GMU will have a delegation of 12 at the upcoming Parliament in August of 2023.

Pacifica Institute in California promoted the event with GMU. Doctor Recep Dogan, an Islamic theologian, was a member of a panel along with Doctor Sterling Harwood, GMU faculty member and author of books on ethics. Doctor Harwood and President Grudzen met with Hans Kung at a week-long seminar on global ethical issues at Santa Clara University in 2005.

### Librarian's Corner



#### Need a book or journal article your library doesn't have?

As you're doing academic research, it often happens that you find a book or article title in one of our online databases, or you read about or hear about it, or see it in a bibliography. It looks perfect for your topic. So, you look it up in your local library's online catalog, but, Oops! nothing there. Your library doesn't have it.

In today's information-seeking

world, almost everything is ultimately available. Even if you live in a remote area, you can contact your local library for help locating almost anything. Nearly all libraries, world-wide, participate in Interlibrary Loan, a collaboration between libraries that lets you request materials from other libraries. That means you can get your hands on all sorts of goodies like books, articles, theses, and more, even if they're not in your own library's collection.

In the United States, most libraries offer a service called Link+, a consortial borrowing program that allows users to request materials from participating libraries. Often, you can request items on Link+ and Interlibrary Loan online, without needing to go into the library. Some libraries will mail the books to you, make them available electronically (eBooks) or send PDFs of journal articles.
