The cohort of 40+ international students started on June 15. Lee McCoy, GMU's Registrar, states, "We have students from three continents, men and women, ranging in age from 20s to 60s! A very diverse group!" Half of the students in the new cohort of the Religion and Science program are receiving financial support from GMU Board of Trustees members. These new students are located in Africa and India and have important pastoral roles In their countries. The GMU Kenyan Fund is also providing scholarships for students.

The Harmony Foundation in Kenya is funding scholarships for several Muslim students in the Religion and Science program and is also supporting the participation of Professor Reginald Nalugala of Tangaza University as a member of the GMU delegation at the Parliament of the World's Religions.

Father Augustine Pamplany of the Science and Religion Institute in India will also join GMU at the Parliament of Religions.

Librarian's Corner



Finding Visual Images

Finding images (pictures of things) online not only is a lot of fun, but it can also aid in your research process. Depending on the topic you're investigating, images can give important insights. Photographs or works of art depicting events, places, people, or objects enhance our understanding of the subject matter under consideration. Even if you don't plan to include images in your research paper, getting an actual picture in your mind is helpful. And images, when appropriate, can enhance and enliven even a formal piece of academic writing.

Of course, you can always Google a topic, then click on "images." But that approach often brings up thousands of hits, many of them completely irrelevant.

There are many compilations of images available online, created by scholarly, academic organizations. Searching for images in these sources ensures authenticity and, often, reliable description and historical context.

Here are a few places to look (this list was compiled by Virginia Seymour for the May 4, 2023, JSTOR article "Learning to Look: How to Find and Choose the Best Images for Your Project"

- 1. <u>The Library of Congress</u> has a vast collection of digitized images—including photographs, maps, and prints—from its own collections as well as other institutions. The images cover a wide range of topics, including American history, world cultures, and science and technology.
- 2. <u>AP Newsroom</u> offers a vast archive of contemporary and historical news photos, covering a wide range of events and subjects from around the world. With a focus on journalism, this resource provides a window into the major news events of the past and present.

- 3. <u>Europeana</u> is a digital library of cultural heritage collections from across Europe, including images, videos, and audio recordings.
- 4. <u>Getty Images</u> is a commercial stock image company that also offers a large selection of historical images, including photographs, illustrations, and artwork. While not all images are free, Getty Images offers a substantial selection of images that can be licensed for use in research and educational settings.
- 5. <u>Digital Public</u> Library of America provides access to millions of digitized materials from libraries, archives, and museums across the United States. It includes a collection of historical images, including photographs, maps, and documents.
- 6. <u>Asia Art Archive</u> collects and provides access to materials related to contemporary art and visual culture in Asia, including photographs, documents, and artworks.
- 7. <u>Digital South Asia Library</u>, from the University of Chicago, provides access to digital materials related to South Asia, including historical photographs, manuscripts, and books from the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. In addition, the <u>South Asia Open Archives (SAOA)</u> is a collaborative, open-access resource for research, teaching, and learning about South Asia.
- 8. <u>Openverse</u> is a Creative Commons search engine that allows users to find and use openly licensed images and other media for a variety of uses.

A Sample of Research Projects Undertaken or Completed by GMU Doctoral Students



Tanmay Dave is conducting a study of the spiritual practices and spiritual communities of Hindu youth residing in the greater Toronto, Canada region. This study will identify organizations with a focus on Hindu youth and the nature of their spiritual practice within a secular Western culture.

Anthony Pino compared the teachings of Christianity and Islam on the spiritual duty of welcoming outsiders (e.g., Immigrants) into your community and providing hospitality and support for them. This study included an analysis of many Islamic organizations in the US that aid the resettlement of immigrants and an examination of the teachings about welcoming immigrants in the Quran and Hadiths of the Islamic faith. Doctor Pino teaches courses in English literature and writing skills at San Jose City College

Michal Lewon is our first American student doing doctoral studies in Religion and Science. He will be focused on the meditative and spiritual practices used to treat and support pain management. Michal serves as a Chaplain at the University of Chicago Hospital.

Eric Quincy Bernard has been researching the impact of the role of diverse theological traditions in the history of Christianity and the roles of interfaith dialogue in this history with an emphasis on the contributions of women. Eric is a Protestant minister serving several rural faith communities in Indiana.

Nihal Sahan studied the role of the Sufi mystical tradition within the Muslim Hizmet movement inspired by Fethullah Gulen. Nihal is a professor of computer science at Santa Clara University and a leader in the Pacifica Institute for the Bay Area.

Doctor Jerry Joseph is working in the field of palliative care at the end of life and researching diverse ways to provide spiritual and emotional support for his patients. He is presently taking a chaplaincy course with GMU as part of his research project



An optional monthly one-hour Zoom Circle will provide the opportunity for dialogue and sharing.


