

The Movement to Excommunicate Misogyny From the Catholic Church


While small grassroots movements pushed for women's ordination in both England and the United States in the early 1900s, the fight began in earnest in the latter half of the twentieth century. Paralleling the rise of global feminist movements, such as the legalization of abortion in the United States, and Protestant denominations beginning to ordain women, Catholic activists began organizing more forcefully. In 1975, the first major gathering, known as the Women's Ordination Conference, took place in Detroit, Michigan, which led to the formation of an organization of the same name that has since hosted numerous similar conferences in the coming years...

Librarian's Corner



Research in Judaica and the Torah

The last couple of months we've been exploring freely available, online, scholarly resources for the study of sacred texts—the Christian Bible, the Qur'an, and Buddhist scriptures. Here are a few selected sources to assist in research in Judaica and the Torah, the foundational text of Judaism. Also referred to as the

Pentateuch or the Five Books of Moses, the Torah consists of the first five books of the Bible. Other significant texts important in the study of Judaism are the *Talmud, Midrash, Mishneh, Zohar (Kabbalah)* and more. The resources below are helpful for many or all of these.

TanakhML Project:

(The Tanakh comprises the Torah (the five Books of Moses), the Nevi'im (the Books of the Prophets), and the Ketuvim

('Writings', eleven books).

This website provides a Hebrew text browser that enables one to travel over the whole *Tanakh* in its fully vocalized version. The King James Version is also included—either as a stand-alone text or as a parallel one—to support the readings. There is also a verse analyzer that enables analysis of (almost) every verse of the non-poetic books of the Bible.

Ets Haim is the oldest still functioning Jewish library in the world. It was founded in 1616 and has been housed in the historical complex of the Portuguese Jewish community of Amsterdam since 1675. 560 manuscripts have been digitized.

Contains articles on Torah, Halacha, Jewish history, archaeology, and texts. Useful for introductory to intermediate research.

Focuses on liturgy, but includes portions, blessings, and commentaries. Useful for exploring the Torah in prayer and ritual contexts.

YUTorah.org (Yeshiva University):

Contains thousands of lectures, articles, and source sheets on Torah, Halacha, and Jewish thought, authored by contemporary scholars and rabbis.

AlHaTorah.org:

Features tools for Torah study: *Parshanut* (commentary) comparison, concordance, maps, charts. Excellent for advanced learners.

Upanishads, and the two great epics, the Mahabharata and Ramayana.






Jesus in Islam

Community Ministry Program



A community ministry degree from GMU includes at least three courses in Sacred Scripture, a six- to nine-month community service placement with supervision, and submission of a journal documenting the learning that has taken place in the community service process. Students will need the equivalent of 60 units of college credit to be eligible for the degree in community ministry. The <u>Stephen Ministry</u> or other community service programs could be options for completing the community service training.

Students will take three online courses with GMU, taught by Father George Gonzales: The Psalms, An Introduction to the New Testament, and a course on pastoral counseling for drug and alcohol dependency.

Additional credit for the equivalent of three courses will be achieved by taking the course in **Stephen Ministry in Atlanta, Georgia.** This course meets weekly beginning in September for about six months. It will include two retreats and be the equivalent of three GMU courses. The final course will be a supervised ministry experience with a community service organization in Atlanta that is working with youth.
